It emphasizes holistic development, integrating academic learning with vocational skills, critical thinking, and creativity.

Key features of NEP

- 1. Multidisciplinary Approach:
 - NEP 2020 advocates for a multidisciplinary approach to higher education, enabling students to pursue a diverse range of subjects across disciplines.
 - It encourages the integration of arts, humanities, sciences, social sciences, and vocational education to promote holistic learning.
 - The student should have pursued 9 credits of multidisciplinary courses at the university.
 - If a student chooses the same multidisciplinary courses for all the nine credits, he/she shall be awarded with Diploma Degree in the chosen field.

2. Multiple entry and exit options

• The policy proposes a flexible undergraduate education structure with multiple entry and exit points, allowing students to choose their courses and pace of learning.

- It enables credit transfer and seamless mobility between institutions through Academic Brank of Credit (ABC).
- The degrees according to the exit are as follows:

3. **Promotion of Research and Innovation:**

- NEP 2020 prioritizes the promotion of research, innovation, and entrepreneurship in higher education institutions.
- The curriculum of the 4th year with research at the university is completely research based to inculcate research fervour among the students.
- Skills like Writing Research proposals, conducting research surveys and field work, writing scientific research paper and dissertation are included in the curriculum.

4. Inclusion of Value Added courses and Ability Enhancement courses

- The policy emphasizes on the holistic development of the students. Apart from the core, minor and multidisciplinary courses, the students should have undergone value-added courses for 6 credits and Ability Enhancement courses for another 8 credits.
- These courses are prudently selected aligning with the guidelines by the NEP.

5. Courses are Practical and Skill oriented:

- Every course under this policy are practical and skill oriented in order to inculcate competence among the students in the required field of work.
- Projects, internships, field work, seminars, presentation, industrial visits are mandatory in all the courses for students to learn the skills and become competent.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

College/ University campus is a place to find valuable friendship and to cherish unforgettable moments. We, here at SRM strongly condemn any kind of ragging practices. We do not believe in violence or unhealthy practices. Our faculty members impart good values with education and that is what sets SRM apart.

What constitutes Ragging?

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- Asking any student to do any such act which he/she would not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- 4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- 5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- 6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- 9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Actions Suggested by UGC / AICTE against students indulging and abetting in Ragging

- The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents. The students who are found to be indulged in ragging should be debarred from taking admission in any technical institution in India.
- 2. Every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FIR) must be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.
- Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following.
 - Cancellation of admission
 - Suspension from attending classes
 - Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
 - Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
 - Withholding results
 - Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
 - Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
 - Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
 - Fine of Rupees 25,000/-
 - Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.
- 4. The institutional authority shall intimate the incidents of ragging occurred in their premises along with actions taken to the Council immediately after occurrence of such incident and inform the status of the case from time to time.
- 5. Courts should make an effort to ensure that cases involving ragging are taken up on priority basis to send the correct message that ragging is not only to be discouraged but also to be dealt with sternness.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- A minimum of <u>75% attendance</u> is required for students to be able to take the end semester examination. Without the minimum attendance of 75%, students become ineligible to write the end semester examination. His / Her registration for that course will be treated as cancelled, and he/she shall be awarded 'W' grade (W stands for registration cancelled for want of minimum attendance) in that course. This grade shall appear in the grade card until the course is successfully completed.
- Attendance between 70% and 75% will be considered on case basis.
- All applications for attendance put up by students must be presented at the end of the semester if required. This means students must keep a copy of all applications with them.
- Leave taken during external examination will be considered as absent and students will have to rewrite their examination in their next semester.
- Mass bunking is a grave offence and exhibits an utter disregard for University rules and norms. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against mass bunking by the Departmental Disciplinary Committee. If more than 90% of the students are missing from the class, it will constitute mass bunking.
- All ODs certified by the concerned faculty will be considered as fully present.
- It is the RESPONSIBILITY of the student to constantly check their attendance averages with the respective subject teachers.

Condonation Policy

If the students have attendance between 65% and 75%, a condonation fees of Rs.
200 per subject will be charged.

Medical Leave Policy

- Attendance equal to and above 60% to 69% will be considered only on valid medical grounds supported by medical certificates or case sheets for hospitalizations. All medical papers must be submitted by students immediately upon joining (maximum 3 days delay after joining class) and **NOT** at the end of the semester.
- All medical reasons will not be entertained. This is subject to approval by the Departmental Leave Approval committee.
- Medical rests prescribed by the doctor should be put up for review by students PRIOR to taking medical rest. If applications are put up POST medical rest all absences will be considered as absent from the class.

- 2. Under disciplinary action, the HOI is empowered to fine, suspend or even expel a student from the university in the interests of the institution.
- 3. BROWSING IS NOT ALLOWED DURING LAB HOURS. Students are not allowed to misuse the internet facilities.
- 4. Every Student shall conduct himself / herself in such a way to cause no disturbance to the working of the classes or to fellow students.
- 5. RAGGING, CONSUMING ALCOHOL AND SMOKING ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED IN THE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS.
- 6. No function shall be arranged by the students in the university campus without prior permission from the HOI.
- 7. Writing on walls, pillars, bath rooms and furniture or black boards is strictly prohibited.
- The cost of any damage, if caused to university property will be charged to the accounts of the students responsible for the damage in addition to disciplinary action.
- 9. Students are advised to switch off fans and lights when they leave the class rooms.
- 10. Furniture in the class rooms should not be moved or displaced.
- 11. Students are expected to be appropriately dressed to attend classes or any university function.
- 12. No students shall remain in the hostel during class hours unless he / she is sick and is permitted to be on leave.
- 13. Wearing of University ID card is compulsory within the campus and on all the occasions.
- 14. Students have to compulsorily wear the university uniform on the specified days (Monday, Wednesday and Friday) and whenever they are representing the university or attending university functions.

Any complaint lodged against indiscipline or any indiscipline noticed within the campus or outside will be addressed by the Discipline Committee and necessary action will be taken.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME "Not Me But You"



- The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an Indian Government sponsored public service program conducted by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports of the Government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's Centenary year, 1969. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in Colleges, Universities and at +2 level working for a campus-community linkage.
- There are two types of activities: Regular Activities (120 hours) and Annual Special Camp (120 hours). All the NSS Volunteers who have served NSS for at list 2 years and have performed 240 hours of work under NSS are entitled to a certificate from the university under the signature of the Vice-Chancellor and the Programme Coordinator. The Annual camps are known as Special Camps. Camps are held annually, funded by the government of India, and are usually located in a rural village or a city suburb. Volunteers may be involved in such activities as:
- Cleaning
- Afforestation
- There are no predefined or pre assigned tasks; it is left up to the volunteers to provide service in any way that is feasible. Camps typically last between a week and 10 days, although camps for shorter periods are also conducted by NSS.
- To recognize the voluntary service rendered by NSS volunteers, Programme Officers (POs), NSS Units and the University NSS Cells, it has been proposed to provide suitable incentives/ awards under the scheme.
- The SRM University of Sikkim has its own registered NSS Cell. In total, it has two NSS Units comprising of 100 students each
- The NSS Cell of SRM University, Sikkim has been conducting many programs on themes related to social service, motivational seminar, blood donation, rallies, cultural program, etc.

UNIVERSITY TRANSPORT FACILITY

The need for safe passage of each student to college and back home is of paramount importance to us. To ensure safe travel the college has its own fleet of outsourced college buses designed as per standards and manned by trained drivers and personnel sensitized to the needs of student. The Transport Service (optional) is operated by the college and a separate transport fee is charged for the same. For supervision and monitoring a transport attendant is on board throughout the journey. Divisions and batches are allotted as per the transport requisitions put forth by the students as transport service is not available for a few batches. If there is any query related to transportation, kindly contact transport Coordinator in 9641590009 before finalizing with the admission process.

Rules Governing Transport Facility

- Transport service is an optional service facilitated and outsourced by the College for the convenience of its students.
- The College bus facility available to the student cannot be expected or demanded as a matter of right. The Transport Department at their own discretion has the right to disallow any student from availing the bus facility.
- Students availing the bus facility will be provided with a bus ID card. Generally, the bus timings will operate within 10 to 15 minutes of the pickup and alighting time. Parents are requested to accommodate the same.
- Any change in the bus timings will be notified to the parent by the Transport Department.
- Students will have to board and alight the school bus at the respective stops allotted to them only. The Transport Department reserves the rights to allot the stops.
- Students while traveling on the school bus must maintain discipline. Any student guilty of misconduct will not be allowed to avail the bus facility.

- A student shall be refused the bus facility if involved in damage to the bus property. Besides, the damage done will have to be compensated by the student.
- Discontinuation of bus facility will only be allowed term wise. Bus facility cannot be discontinued for any particular month.
- No transport facility shall be available for other activities / events that school may plan on holidays / vacations.
- Students/ parents will not have any transactions / altercation / physical fight with the bus staff. Bus employees are not authorized to change/add bus stops.
- The school has taken utmost care for the safety and convenience of the students.
- Any suggestion/ complaint regarding the transport service is to be made in writing strictly to the Transport Department and the same shall be entertained by the Transport Department only.
- It is important that any change to the usual pick-up/ drop routine is intimated to the transport in charge a day in advance.
